Message from the Resettlement Committee

Since its formation a year ago, BAAT's Resettlement Committee (RC) has been assisting people of Burma who relocated to Houston. Due to the recent surge of Burmese families relocating to Houston (approximately 70- 80 refugee families), RC is in dire need for committed volunteers.

Please note that the majority of newly relocated people are not equipped with language and job skills that would enable them to quickly integrate into an Englishspeaking, industrialized society. Because of their social, educational and economic background, the limited relocation assistance they receive from the resettlement agencies is not enough for them. Unfortunately, Houston does not have an adequate bus system that will take them to places they need to go. And they are yet to learn the limited Metro bus routes and challenging roads of Houston. Therefore, RC is actively looking for Burmese language translators, teachers for various topics including English and life skills, and volunteer drivers. (RC plans to have a training session and curriculum for teachers/trainers). RC is also collecting clothing and shoes for all ages especially cold weather clothing for young children, undergarments, toys, books and any educational material that would help expedite the English language learning process of the newcomers.

Presently there are about 10+ volunteers in RC who are assisting newcomers in many ways. When providing assistance, Burmese Refugees are assisted and supported regardless of their origin and their religious background. It is our goal to help everyone equally due to the fact that they are fellow Burmese and human beings in need of our help. RC thanks BAAT's Board of Directors, other volunteers, especially Daw Terry Win, Sui Hnuang Chin (Chin Ko Shwe), Ko Ko Naing, Zaw Myo Aung, and Go Than Tuang for their unwavering assistance to the newcomers. Thanks are also due to those who made monetary contributions large and small. If you are bilingual (Burmese, Karen, Chin and English) or have time and interest to help out the newcomers who desperately need and appreciate your assistance, please contact Shwe Tun Aung (713-447-0438)Lillian Min (832-236-6900), Aye Aye Khaine (832-563-4827 or email: bhag.now@tmail.com) and Charlotte O'Sullivan (832-746-9086).
