

MISSION STATEMENT

To establish a multi-ethnic, non-denominational activity center called the <u>Burmese</u> Cultural Center of <u>Texas</u> to promote <u>Burmese</u> culture, language, literature, and works of art by equipping it with a library in order to educate the public at large in <u>Burmese</u> culture through reading and self-exploration.

To sponsor and invite well-known <u>Burmese</u> scholars, artists, musicians, and religious and spiritual philosophers to conduct and present seminars, classes, and educational workshops with the purpose of promoting and educating the public on various facets of <u>Burmese</u> culture.

To promote and foster friendship, fellowship, and racial harmony between the <u>Burmese</u> and all other racial and ethnic groups living in the United States of America through cross-cultural social activities that engender cultural interactions amongst a diverse community.

To help eliminate prejudice and discrimination and establish fraternal relations amongst members of the community by encouraging and advancing cultural diversity and tolerance towards ethnic and racial differences through cultural awareness programs and social activities.

To assist the <u>Burmese</u> immigrants in learning the English language and provide the upward mobility necessary to improve their socio-economic conditions.

DO YOU KNOW HOW BAAT ORIGINATED?

Twenty six years ago, approximately 50 Burmese adults and children celebrated the Annual Water Festival on April 14 at Bear Creek Park in Houston, Texas. As if Thagyar Min (The King of the Celestial Beings) wanted to bless the Burmese folks for celebrating the first water festival in Houston, rain poured down heavily that day and doused all picnic participants. Never the less, the notion to plan a more organized celebration was born that day. In the following year, 1986, approximately 100 people attended an organized picnic at Bear Creek Park on April 20.

Three years later, a formal organization was formed and Articles of Incorporation for the Burmese American Association of

Texas (BAAT) was submitted to the Secretary of State of Texas in March 1989. The first Board of Directors were Norman Zaw Wong, Min Jack Tham and Peter Saw
